



OH COVID 19 Region Map






Current Zone 3/Region 6 Dashboard

Vaccinations

- Nursing Facilities and Assisted Living signed up via NHSN or a REDCap link. 11/6/2020 deadline
- CVS and Walgreens to secure COVID-19 vaccine and provide on-site vaccination of residents in LTCF, at no cost to the facility. This program provides end-to-end management of the COVID-19 vaccination process
- Vaccinations will be initially distributed to public health and hospitals
- Phase 1a: health care workers, first responders, people with two or more risk factors
- Phase 1b: underlying health conditions, 65+ in congregate care facilities, two or more chronic conditions
- **Phase 2**: Teachers, child care, moderate risk conditions, under 65 in congregate care facilities
- **Phase 3**: Employees in critical industries
- **Phase 4**: everyone else

Vaccine Distribution

- Dispensing via hospitals, public health, major pharmacies such as CVS and Walgreens
- BioNTech Pfizer
 - Requires storage @ -90 F.
 - Distribution within 5 days @ refrigerator temp
- Moderna
 - Requires storage @ -4 F.
 - Distribution withing 14 days @ refrigerator temp
- Both will require two Doses
- Recent studies indicate 90% of exposed persons have significant antibody count at 6-8 months, but even when it wanes, there appears to be protection.
- Vaccines are "Another layer of PPE" the need for Public Education

What does research say about COVID 19 Transmission?

- The majority of COVID 19 transmissions occur from Pre-symptomatic people
- Most transmission are from airborne respiratory droplets
 - Masks
 - Social Distancing
 - Time
 - Studies have shown the virus can persist suspended in air for up to 16 hours.
- ∘ ~6% are from environmental contamination, contact transmission

About Masks...

- Double layer Cotton Masks work
- Surgical Masks are up to 3x better
 - Block virus from electrostatic charge applied to the fiber
 - Blocks 99% of respiratory droplets
- kn95 masks made in china <8% leakage
- N95 masks made by 3M 0% leakage
 - Requires fitting for proper use
 - o aerosolizing procedures- mostly used in hospital settings
 - N95 masks with valve are banned in many cities, designed for construction

PPE Works!

- Early in the pandemic, health care workers contracted COVID-19 in health care settings due to inadequate PPE supplies, and the unknowns about preventing transmission.
- Per Dr. Williams at the Mayo Clinic (11/2020):
 - 93% of staff were infected in the community; and most of those who were infected at work, contracted the virus while eating together without a mask during their breaks.
- Per national nursing home calls when medical directors did genomic testing on the virus of infected staff, they also found that it did not match the patients'.
- PPE, particularly masks and face shield, work!

PPE and Home Care

Standard PPE:

- Surgical Mask
- Frequent handwashing

COVID+ PPE:

- Within 7 days of positive test, and care that is close contact (6')
- Surgical Mask and Face Shield or Goggles
- N95 and Face Shield or Goggles




